## **Weekends in the Parks – 2nd Edition Come Spend the Summer with Us!**

**Kuujuuaq, Québec, May 23, 2016** – The Kativik Regional Government (KRG) and Nunavik Parks are pleased to announce Weekends in the Parks for the second consecutive year. Thirteen summer discovery packages are being organized in 2016 for Nunavik residents at Parc national des Pingualuit, Parc national Kuururjuaq and Parc national Tursujuq. Activities include hiking, canoeing and kayaking, camping, wildlife observation, relaxing next to a park cabin, contact with our local guides and immersion in the magic of Nunavik’s natural environments.

Weekends in the Parks is for those who dream of experiencing the region’s spectacular national parks, from outdoor enthusiasts seeking their next new adventure to family and friends looking for a great way to spend time together.

“The response generated by last summer’s Weekends in the Parks was outstanding,” emphasized Patrick Graillon, Assistant Director for Parks with the KRG Renewable Resources, Environment, Lands and Parks Department. “Nunavimmiut have said they want to experience still more of all that our great parks have to offer and we’re proud to oblige.”

Nunavik parks are immense territories protecting the natural features, landscapes and wildlife of the region. The pristine waters of Lake Pingualuk and its circular crater, the valley of the Koroc River in the Torngat Mountains, the diverse plants and wildlife of Lake Tasiujaq, and the powerful Nastapoka Falls are but a few examples.

Registrations open **Wednesday, June 1, 2016, at 9 a.m.** by calling (telephone only) to the park of your choice. Spaces are limited and available on a first-come first-served basis.

Packages include return transportation to the parks by air charter (Pingualuit and Kuururjuaq only), local guides and lodging. Registrations can include up to four participants.
