### The Nunavik Parks website is now up and running

**Kuuujuaq, Québec – May 2, 2008** – The Nunavik Parks website, which is under the responsibility of the Parks Section of the Renewable Resources Department of the Kativik Regional Government (KRG), is now up and running. Anyone who wishes to visit the site can do so by entering [www.nunavikparks.ca](http://www.nunavikparks.ca) into their web browser.

The site is in French, English and Inuktitut. It is not only filled with beautiful photographs and great information about Nunavik's Pingualuit Park, Kuururjuaq Park project and Richmond Gulf and Clearwater Lake Park project, their regulations and conservation policies but also contains information about Nunavik, its history, culture, science, nature, wildlife, plants, geology, hydrology and geomorphology.

Under the Pingualuit Park Section, which is Nunavik's first National park, other important information such as operating hours, how and where to make reservations, fees, how to get to the parks and weather information can also be found. It is a one stop browse to an adventure into one of Nunavik's Parks.

*The Kativik Regional Government (KRG) is a non-ethnic public organization created in 1978, under the James Bay and Northern Quebec Agreement, whose jurisdiction covers nearly the entire territory of Quebec north of the 55th parallel. The KRG administers the affairs of Nunavik in the areas of municipal affairs, transportation, environment, police, employment, manpower training, income security, childcare services, renewable resources, land-use management, civil security and economic development.*
